


Congressional Appropriations Process



August September October November December January




Representatives return to their districts to meet with constituents. President



Finalized appropriations bills sent to president for signature by midnight on September 30th.

If Congress fails to meet the October 1st deadline, it must enact a Continuing Resolution (CR). A CR allows the government to temporarily continue operating at the previous year's funding levels.

While Congress traditionally considers and approves each regular appropriations bill separately, delays can lead to an Omnibus appropriations bill, in which several bills are combined into a single legislative vehicle.

*If Congress does not meet the April 15th deadline, there are exceptions in law that allow them to move forward with appropriations legislation.
